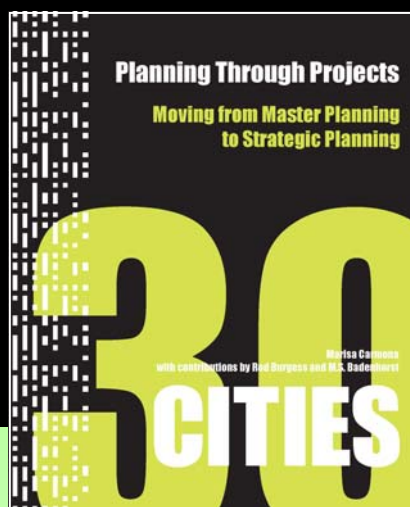


Planning Through Projects
